



The Mobile Dairy Classrooms are part of a dynamic educational program sponsored by the Southwest Dairy Museum, Inc. The 32-foot classrooms feature a fully operational milking parlor. Each classroom carries a live cow to schools, fairs, and festivals throughout the Southwest.

The Mobile Dairy Classrooms are enjoyed by all ages, but targeted toward second grade through high school. Instructors can teach 100-200 children per presentation and give five demonstrations a day. There is no charge for the Mobile Dairy Classroom Program—it is courtesy of Southwest Dairy Farmers.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The Mobile Dairy Classroom is a division of the Southwest Dairy Museum Inc., a non-profit, educational and promotional organization that is funded by the dairy farm families of the Southwest. The Dairy Classroom is a free program for schools, fairs, and festivals. It's a traveling milking parlor, carrying a live cow and providing an oral presentation, a milking demonstration, and a question and answer session. The Classroom will need a 45 to 50 foot parking space. A teacher's guide with student activities titled "Milk from Cow to Kids" will be given to each classroom. The Instructor will also leave an educational video, "The Buttercup Story," for the school library.

The presentations are designed to address the appropriate age of our audience. It is intended to enrich the public with basic knowledge of the dairy farmer, milk cows, production and the processing of dairy products, and the value of dairy foods in a healthy, well balanced diet. Our educational programs relate to math, science, health (nutrition), sanitation, and food safety. Instructors can teach approximately 1000 students per school visit and, for the cows' sake, not exceed 5 milking demonstrations per day. Request forms are also available and can be submitted online through our website at southwestdairyfarmers.com.

Your school will not have to reschedule due to weather conditions. Our Instructor can present an excellent inclement weather program in the classroom or auditorium that includes visual aids as well as hands on materials.
