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Mobile Dairy Classroom Continues To Grow And Tell The Dairy Story

"No more pencils, no more books ... School's out for summer!" This is the jingle for a popular commercial that is supposed to express the views of students throughout the nation. Memorial Day has passed and summer is in full swing! It seems like a great time to recap the past school year and the impact of the Mobile Dairy Classrooms in the states we serve.

With 12 units at the beginning of the school year, serving 8 states year round and 2 states seasonally, more than 342,000 students and 153,000 general public were seen this past school

year, with visits to 824 schools. Three instructors took 2 week stints each in Arizona in January and the first 2 weeks of February. They saw approximately 9,500 students at 36 schools. On the east coast, one of our Southland instructors spent 6 weeks in Florida and saw over 10,000 students at 28 schools. That means the MDC instructors presented the message about the importance of dairy in a healthy diet, corrected some of the misinformation that is being disseminated, and helped

share what America's dairy producers do every day to provide a wholesome, safe, nutritious product to almost 500,000 people last school year! For schools that are dealing with financial crises and facing major budget cuts, the cost of the program is an added incentive: the program comes to them at no cost!

There have been some personnel changes this year as well. Last year when Southland was started in the eastern part of the U.S.,

Michaela Sanders, served Kentucky and, Courtney Bumgarner served both North Carolina and Virginia. In February of this year, a separate unit was set up to serve Virginia with Amanda Griffith moving to the area. Response has been tremendous and "word of mouth" advertising is still one of the best recommendations for our program. In the Southwest area, L.P. Voskamp retired at the end of December 2015.

To replenish our Southwest staff, John Crawford, Sr., a former Texas dairy farmer, was hired part time this spring to help fill

> some of the gaps in areas that had events scheduled. He spent time in schools in Midland, Corpus Christi, and Canadian/Shamrock area seeing students, along with Kids, Kows, & More events in Amarillo, Crosbyton and Odessa. He also went to Beaumont to the South Texas Fair. He took the dairy message to almost 19,000 students and adults at these

During the 2015-16 school year, Southland Dairy Farmers' Mobile Dairy Class-

room has reached 114,800 kids, parents and teachers through 569 presentations at 260 schools. Our MDC presentations at state fairs, educational events, and local community events increase these totals to 160,870 people with 993 presentations during the 2015-16 school year ending May 31, 2016. The program has exceeded every goal set by Southland Dairy for its first year, and the requests for presentations and school visits continues to grow.
