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

Southwest Cream of Tomato Soup

Ingredients:

- 1/4 cup unsalted butter
- ½ cup finely minced yellow onion
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 (28 oz.) can diced tomatoes
- 1 (10.5 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chiles
- 2 tablespoons freshly chopped cilantro
- 1 teaspoon granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons dried cumin
- 2 teaspoons chili powder
- 1/4 teaspoon ground oregano
- ½ teaspoon cayenne powder (more or less to taste)
- 1 pint half-and-half
- 1 cup sour cream, divided use

Garnish: Sour cream, cilantro, and tortilla strips

Instructions:

1. In a large saucepan over medium-high heat, melt butter; sauté onions until tender, about 5 minutes. Sprinkle in flour and garlic; cook, stirring constantly, for one minute.

2. Slowly add half-and-

half, whisking until mixture is thickened and creamy.

- 3. Reduce heat to medium, and add diced tomatoes, diced tomatoes with green chiles, and seasonings (cilantro through cayenne); bring to a simmer, stirring frequently.
- 4. Remove from heat, and carefully blend soup using an immersion blender, or puree in blender until smooth.
- 5. Stir in 1/3 cup of sour cream, and use remaining sour cream to garnish each serving.
