A Special National Ice Cream Month Recipe!

Salted Carmel Pecan No-Churn Ice Cream

INGREDIENTS & DIRECTIONS FOR SUGARED PECANS

- 1/2 c. brown sugar
- ½ tsp. salt
- 2 tsp. water
- 1 c. pecans
- . Glaze the pecans by placing the brown sugar, water and salt in a non-stick skillet and cook for 2 minutes. Add the pecans and stir constantly for 4 minutes.
- 2. Pour onto a cookie sheet covered with parchment paper and let cool completely. Break into small pieces and set to the side.

INGREDIENTS & DIRECTIONS FOR THE SALTED CARAMEL SAUCE

- 1 c. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- ½ c. water
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- ½ c. butter
- 3/4 c. heavy whipping cream
- Heat the sugar and water in a heavy saucepan until completely melted and clear. Add the butter and continue cooking over medium heat until the butter starts to turn a caramel color.
- 2. Remove from heat and add the salt and vanilla. Cool completely.

INGREDIENTS & DIRECTIONS FOR THE ICE CREAM MIXTURE

- 2 c. heavy whipping cream
- 14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tbsp. vanilla
- 1. In the bowl of a mixer, use the whisk attachment to beat cream on high speed until the cream forms stiff peaks, about 3 - 5 minutes.
- 2. In a separate bowl, combine the condensed milk and vanilla. When mixture is completely blended, gently fold in whipped cream.
- 3. Line a freezer-safe large loaf pan or a 9 x 13 pan with plastic wrap.
- 4. Fold in the sugared pecans to the whipped cream mixture then pour 1/3 of the mixture in the pan. Drizzle half of the caramel sauce on the top and add another third of the cream mixture. Drizzle with the remaining caramel sauce on top, then finish with the remaining cream mixture.
- 5. Cover with plastic wrap and place in the freezer for at least 6 hours or until fully frozen.
- 6. Scoop and enjoy!
