

New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum in Las Cruces Begins Renovation of the Dairy Barn

The Dairy Barn at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum in Las Cruces was built in 1995, with a donation from the Southwest Dairy Museum, making it the first structure on the southern half of the Museum's 47-acre campus. For many years, the barn provided a theater-type atmosphere for guests to watch a milking demonstration. Displays in the barn highlighted the history of dairy farming in New Mexico.

"Our long-standing partnership with the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum continues to build on our objectives to educate young and old alike about the dairy industry and the good nutritional and wholesome products produced by New Mexico and American dairy farmers," said Jim Hill, CEO, Southwest Dairy Farmers. Roasted Corn and Cheese Dip

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
- 12oz. pkg. frozen corn
- 8oz. pkg. cream cheese (soft)
- 1/2 c. mayonnaise
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon hot sauce
- 1 c. sharp cheddar cheese (shredded)
- 1 c. mild cheddar cheese (shredded)
- 1 c. Swiss cheese (shredded)
- 1/2 c. red onion (chopped)
- 6 slices of bacon



DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Cook bacon and crumble. Set aside.
- 2. Melt butter in a skillet, then add the corn and garlic salt. Cook the corn until slightly browned, stirring frequently, then set it aside to add later.
- 3. With a mixer, blend the softened cream cheese, mayonnaise, salt, pepper, hot sauce, sharp cheddar cheese, mild cheddar cheese and Swiss cheese.
- 4. Fold in the onion, cooked corn, and crumbled bacon.
- 5. Serve with chips or crackers.
